To minimize the risks to confidentiality, we will store audio/video recording files on the encrypted Georgia Tech Box online storage service, only accessible to the researchers on this project via campus ID password login.

The stories you create can be done using your choice of physical paper, Miro, Figma, Google Slides/Docs, or Microsoft Word/Powerpoint. If using an online tool, we will create a template and configure the settings so that you do not need to create an account or share personal information in order to access the tool.

The risks involved are no greater than those involved in daily activities. You will not benefit or be compensated for joining this study. We will comply with any applicable laws and regulations regarding confidentiality. To make sure that this research is being carried out properly, the Georgia Institute of Technology IRB may review study records. The Office of Human Research Protections may also look at study records.
